Student-Led Portfolio Conferences

Third trimester portfolio conferences will be held on **Thursday, June 14th**. This is a special opportunity for BAIS families to celebrate the students' accomplishments over the course of this school year. For these **student-led** conferences, the homeroom teacher will be there to support the students as needed, but will play a minimal role in the student's presentation. We will send standards-based narrative report cards the following week with further detail about each student's learning and accomplishments this trimester.

Remember that **children do not come to school on the portfolio conference day except to attend the conferences with their parents and teachers**. We will send portfolio conference schedules to all families by email this week. These schedules show the designated time for your child to present their portfolio to their parents/caretakers in their homeroom classroom. It is important to be on time for your conference so you can make full use of this important time with your child. Please meet with your child's specialist teachers (Ms. Leah, Mr. Badjie, Mr. Wright, and Mr. Daniel) before or after the student-led conferences. Contact your child's homeroom teacher directly if for any reason you are unable to attend the conference at the scheduled time.

End-of-Year Party

The Student Council is excited to announce that the **End-of-Year Party** for all BAIS students and families will be this **Friday, June 8th**, from **5:00 to 8:00pm** at **The Village** complex in Kololi. Food will be provided for all BAIS students using funds raised this year at the Halloween Party and other Student Council events, and there will be food and drinks available for parents and other family members to purchase at The Village. Parents or other caretakers should plan on attending with your children, as BAIS staff cannot take responsibility for supervising all children at the party. Students will receive invitations with more details about the end-of-year party this week. We're excited to see you there!


New Teachers for 2018-2019
