Model United Nations

Mr. Robert first approached me with the idea of starting a Model UN program during his initial visit, and we decided this year was the perfect time to bring it to life. In collaboration with Mr. Will, a colleague and friend from who has experience working at the United Nations, I'm excited to announce the launch of our Model UN After-School Activity, titled Mastering Diplomacy.

Reflecting on my own experience participating in NHSMUN, where I was honored to win an award, I can say that it was a transformative opportunity that opened my eyes to global issues, diplomacy, and the importance of international cooperation. It sharpened my public speaking, negotiation, and critical thinking skills, while fostering an appreciation for diverse perspectives and the complexity of world affairs. More than that, it sparked in me a passion for diplomacy and international relations that continues to this day. It's a true pleasure to now offer this experience on a much smaller scale to our students, and I hope it inspires in them the same curiosity and passion for the world that it did for me. Through Mastering Diplomacy, I believe they will gain valuable skills in collaboration, problem-solving, and global awareness, which are essential in today's interconnected world. I'm excited to see where this journey will take them!

Overview of the ASA:

- **Week 1:** We kicked off with an introduction to Model UN, discussing its format and the art of diplomacy.
- **Week 2:** Students participated in an icebreaker where they represented different countries. They have to research their assigned countries.
- **Week 3:** We'll work on drafting position papers, and explore major global issues through discussions and group research presentations.
- **Week 4:** will Focus on enhancing debate and public speaking skills, students engaged in mini-debates and will receive constructive feedback.
- **Week 5:** Students will learn negotiation tactics and draft resolutions through role-playing scenarios.
- **Week 6:** we will hopefully conduct a mock Model UN conference, allowing students to experience the simulation first-hand.
- **Week 7:** The final week will emphasize leadership and teamwork in a "Model UN Awards" ceremony to celebrate their achievements. Hopefully we can have a few guests from the UN office to join and speak to the students to continue their quest of diplomacy.

I'm looking forward to the upcoming sessions where we'll dive deeper into country research, global issues, and the skills needed for effective diplomacy. My hope is that by the end of this course, students will have a solid foundation in Model UN practices, improved public speaking and negotiation skills, and a deeper understanding of global issues, all of which will prepare them for future competitions.

More about the Writing Diagnostics

We are pleased to share that our students, from Kindergarten through Middle School, have successfully completed their writing diagnostic assessments for the beginning of the year. This important assessment asks students to write two different types of pieces: an expository piece and a narrative piece. We will repeat the assessment at the end of the year to measure their growth and progress in writing.

The purpose of this diagnostic assessment is twofold. First, it helps us track each student's development as a writer throughout the year. Second, it gives teachers invaluable insight into specific areas where students may need additional support, whether in generating ideas, organizing their thoughts, or refining their sentence structure. This information allows us to tailor our instruction to better meet the needs of each individual learner, ensuring that every student has the opportunity to improve and succeed.

We assess the students' writing using the **6+1 Writing Traits Rubric**, which evaluates key components such as voice, punctuation, sentence structure, presentation, ideas, and the overall flow of the writing. By focusing on these elements, we can offer meaningful feedback to help students develop as confident and effective writers.

This test is important for our school because strong writing skills are foundational not just in English Language Arts, but across all subjects. Being able to clearly communicate ideas, structure thoughts, and present information coherently is a critical life skill. The writing diagnostic also aligns with our school's commitment to academic excellence and growth, helping us ensure that each child is continually advancing in their ability to express themselves both creatively and analytically.

We look forward to seeing the tremendous growth our students will make this year, and we are excited to partner with you in supporting them on their writing journey!
