Staff Spotlight Ms. Halima



I'm Halimatu Jawara, an elementary teacher who is deeply passionate about education and the students I have the privilege to teach each day. Teaching at theBanjul American International School (BAIS) has been a remarkable journey of growth and connection. Now in my second year here, I taught 1st grade last year and moved with my class to 2nd grade this year. Watching my students learn and grow every day is truly a gift-they are the lights of my world. My experience as a student teacher at BAIS was transformational, thanks in large part to my mentor, Ms. Sanyang, whose guidance shaped my teaching approach and taught me the importance of patience, encouragement, and celebrating each student's milestones.

My path to teaching started in a different direction. I grew up in The Gambia until high school, then moved to the United States to pursue a Bachelor's degree in Political Science with a focus on International Relations, and minors in International Business and Arabic. I initially aspired to work in law or global governance to address social inequalities affecting children, particularly in West Africa. But with time, I realized that true societal progress begins with empowering the next generation through education.

While earning my Master's at Drexel University, I worked as both a nanny and a Graduate and Research Assistant, and I also served as a teaching assistant in the Philadelphia public school system. These experiences built my skills in classroom management, research, and direct student engagement, ultimately inspiring me to focus fully on teaching. After earning my Master's of Science in Teaching, Learning, and Curriculum: Teacher Certification (PreK-4) in 2023 (minoring in International Education), I returned to The Gambia to begin my teaching career at BAIS, a place that fills me with inspiration and gratitude every day. In addition to teaching, I have been a UNICEF consultant, assisted with communications and program development, served as a legal assistant for a human rights lawyer with CAIR, and managed a political campaign. These roles broadened my understanding of education policy and advocacy, solidifying mycommitment to increasing educational opportunities in underserved communities. Outside of teaching, I love writing, reading, music, art, cooking, and taking long walks along the beach, where I find time to recharge and reflect. Looking ahead, I aspire to pursue a Ph.D. in Early Childhood and Special Education or Child Psychology, focusing my research on underserved areas, particularly in The Gambia-as less than 1 percent of the global output of scholarly articles came from Africa. I also hope to establish a nonprofit organization dedicated to raising awareness and support for early childhood education. For me, education is not just a profession-it's a calling, one that I pursue wholeheartedly.

NOVEMBER IS BOOK MONTH AT BAIS!

As always, the purpose of Book Month is to support students in every grade in becoming active, enthusiastic readers by encouraging and highlighting reading for pleasure, both at home and in school. We organize a variety of special events and programs throughout the month to celebrate books and promote reading and writing.

Below are details about our many Book Month activities. Most of these events and programs just need **faculty support**, **encouragement**, **and participation**, while some may require **parent support or family involvement**. Please read through the information to learn how you can help make this year's Book Month a success!

By working together as a school community, we can inspire students to discover the joy of reading and create lasting memories through fun and engaging activities.

HOW CAN PARENTS HELP?

- Review the below information so you know what's coming as part of Book Month.
- Support your children by asking about the book cover design they will present for The Illustrator' Tea on Friday, November 29th (see details below);
- Encourage participation (and read yourself!) to pump up your kids for Book Month programs. Share in the excitement by talking about the books you're reading or revisiting some of your favorite childhood reads to inspire and motivate them.
- Offer incentives to encourage the participation of your middle school and high school-aged children. Set up fun challenges that can encourage them to get involved in reading.
- Volunteer to be a mystery reader, a guest reader, or to suggest possible classroom connections or recommendations you have to make this year's Book Month a success.

ONGOING PROGRAMS THROUGHOUT THE MONTH

School-Wide Reading Challenge/Reading Logs

Each grade level will be given a weekly goal of non-required reading minutes that will contribute to a school-wide reading goal:

Weekly Goals (Individuals)

- PK Grade 1: 100 mins
 - o (20 mins per day M-F, weekends count as extra minutes or makeup time)
- Grades 2 5: 150 mins
 - o (30 mins per day M-F, weekends count as extra minutes or makeup time)
- Grades 6 & Up: 225 mins
- (45 mins per day M-F, weekends count as extra minutes or makeup time.)

School-Wide Goal = 1,000 hours!



Drop Everything & Read (D.E.A.R) Time

Surprise D.E.A.R. Time in November!

Every day in November, we will surprise students with a **D.E.A.R.** (**Drop Everything and Read**) time, announced over the intercom. Here's what to know:

- **When**: The reading time will be announced randomly each day—students won't know when it's coming, but teachers will!
- What to do: When the announcement is made, drop everything and read for 10 minutes.
- Be prepared: Independent readers should always have a book with them in every class. PK-G1 teachers should have books ready for spontaneous read-alouds.

Let's embrace the fun of reading at any moment!

Mystery Readers

Once a week in November, elementary students gather for a quick read aloud in the library by a special guest "mystery reader" during morning circle from 8:00-8:15 am.

Students are given clues about the mystery reader and try to guess who it is before the big reveal. Past mystery readers have included MS/HS students, current/former faculty & staff, parents & community members, etc.

Book Swap Friday, November 15th, 2024

As part of this year's Book Month, we would be having a book swap day on November 15th. Students are encouraged to bring in books they are willing to part with from home to swap with fellow classmates. This will be a brilliant way to give a much loved book a fresh leash on life in a cozy new home.

Surprise D.E.A.R. Time in November!

Reading Logs for November

Students will soon receive their very pink reading logs to track their independent reading. Here are the key points to remember for this:

- **What counts**: Only personal reading done by choice (not required reading, homework, D.E.A.R. time, or class assignments).
- **Bring logs to the library**: Please remind your children to bring their reading logs to every library class throughout November.
- MS/HS students: Reading logs will be collected every Friday morning.
- School-wide display: Students can add their favorite books to a display in the library.
- **Rewards**: Small prizes will be awarded for reaching weekly reading goals. If we meet our school-wide goal, we'll plan something special—last year, it was a trip to the beach!

Let's make November a month full of reading adventures!

MS/HS Book/Audio Book Club

During lunch, participants have the opportunity to come together to select, read, listen to, and discuss a common book of their choice.
