Bonjour...A salam malekum!

I am the BAIS French teacher and Gambian Studies focal point. I am Gambian and have taught French for many years in various institutions in the Gambia, including Alliance Française and the University of The Gambia. I hold teaching certificates in French didactics / pedagogy and a Master's Degree from Limoges University (France).

I joined BAIS eight years ago from teaching adults from the University of Gambia. I must confess that it was a bit of a challenge to handle the lower grades in terms classroom management and transition. I confided with the director then and benefitted from the support from colleagues to improving with this. This is one of the things BAIS does best.

Every year looks different at BAIS, and this requires one to be flexible, and to quickly adapt to new setups. I particularly like collaborating with colleagues in designing and teaching units. We are a small school and many times one's duties, responsibilities or role expands quickly to areas one did not think off. Such was the case when I was made Chair of the Finance during the reaccreditation of the school. A good experience, indeed!

My goal is to maintain an environment where the French language will be spoken even outside the classroom. I particularly like seeing students from all grade levels shine during our Celebration of Learning. One notable achievement of the French curriculum is the HS French Literature program which was developed a few years ago and which will produce its first graduands this year.

As the Gambian Studies focal point, I would like to promote the local culture in the school. I look forward to supporting the final draft of the program on Learning about the Gambia and implementing it these coming years.

On a personal note, I am married and my wife Isabelle and I are blessed with three children who were or are currently BAIS alumni. When I am not teaching, I enjoy volunteering for my community and others in rural Gambia. I work with several youth groups and also serve as Board Chair of a local nursery school. I was also a Board member of Alliance Française for many years. My passion for children inspired me to initiate of a summer camp for kids of an organization that I am a member. My hobbies include gardening, camping, volleyball and frequent travels to my ancestral village.
